

St Albans conversational English class is held on **Monday morning 10.00-11.30am** and is for all levels of English. The class is not explicitly Christian, although we do cover Easter and Christmas. In the past there have been people of other faiths in this class. Everyone is welcome to this **free class**.

The programme coordinator is a qualified ESOL teacher with over 25 years' experience. She plans all lessons for the volunteer teachers. Topics for Term 1 2016 are: Waitangi day, meals, and Easter with a pronunciation focus on the final /n/ in words - difficult for many who speak languages with words ending with a vowel, and for those whose language does not distinguish between /l/, /r/ and /n/.

Topics for Term 2 2016 are the supermarket and birthdays with /p/ and /f/ as the pronunciation focus.

The morning begins with some singing to help English pronunciation and sentence structure. We then divide into small groups of 1-6 people according to ability, with a teacher for each group. The groups cover the same material during the term but at different speed and depth.

A **Wednesday morning** class is held from **10am -12noon** for intermediate and advanced learners who would like to learn more about the bible. This involves more difficult English and so is not suitable for beginner learners. People do not need to be Christians to come to this class. It is designed to help anyone learn more about God and the bible. This class is also **free**.

Classes are held upstairs at St Albans church 339 Albert Street, during the primary school term. 2016 classes begin on 1 February.
